




Organizational Chart - MINISTRY

INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Youth, Sports & Transport functions under the overall guidance of the Minister and Minister of State and Chief Executive Officer. The Ministry is comprised of mainly three (3) separate Departments, namely, The Department of Youth Services, The National Sports Council of Belize, a statutory body, and The Department of Transport. A Director is appointed as head of the respective Departments, also representing the Government of Belize.

To present, The Director of Youth Services is responsible to manage and promote the development of our youths to strengthen their social, ethical, emotional, physical, and cognitive competencies. The Director of Sports manages the council affairs and is responsible to manage sporting facilities under the council and promote all sport disciples. The Chief Transport Officer responsible for all matters related to licensing of motor vehicles, all road transport, traffic enforcement and the administration of her department. The matters relating to Human Resource, Finance & Audit are under the charge of the Administrative Officer, Financial Officer & Chief Everutive Officer.

The sanctioned strength of the Ministry as of March 31, 2021, is at Three Hundred Sixty (360), all of whom are vibrant and competent to achieving the strategic goals of the Ministry; whilst attaining Plan Belize.

- Amalgamation of all youth services operated by the Government of Belize.
- Creation of six thematic areas for the Department which are: Youth Governance and planning Services, Youth Technology and Art Services, Belize Youth Training Institute, Youth Entrepreneurship and on the job Skills Training, Services, Conflict Management and behaviour modification Services, and Youth Counselling and wellness services.
- Ownership of young people in their own building, before the department was in a rented hotel.
- Development of a National 1year Strategic Plan for and by young people.
- National Youth Needs Survey for over (6,000) six thousand young people countrywide where we trained and hire 75 Youth Data Collectors.
- Establishment of the Violence Interrupters Program.
- (1800) one thousand eight hundred young people trained in the Customer Service.
- Our Belize Youth Training services has developed Curriculums for Front Office, Tour Guide, Agriculture, Math, Literacy, Financial Literacy, Barbering, sports, Life skills.
- Establishment of the Multi-sectoral committee to combat crime and violence in Belize City as well as school re-entry.
- Had over 100 students Enrolled in our pilot program for the Belize Youth Training Services.
- Trained 60 Youths in Basic and advance Alternative to violence Program training, 60 Youths trained in counselling and 20 Youths trained as Mentors.
- 12 The Development of a mentoring Curriculum.
- Developed DYS E-Forms Online Platform alongside with an E-Form Database.

- Successfully produced and published 2021 Belize Youth Awards.
- DYS Recording studio produce and record over 100 songs nationally.
- Partnered with DFC in offering Loans up to \$5,000 to young Entrepreneurs.
- We have a partnership with UB where 2 staff per year will be accepted to enrolled in a Bachelors degree program.
- 18 Recruited and trained 250 young people which was later successful placed at a job through our On-the-Job Skills Training Service Area.
- The running of our grieving Mother's Association and mother who lost children to gun violence.
- 20 Counselling sessions nationally for over 600 youth.
- Staff underwent several trainings to aid in capacity building some of these trainings are: Trauma Inform Care, Solution Focus Brief Therapy, Suicide Prevention and safety, suicide factors signs and symptoms, Adverse childhood Experience, Andragony Training.
- Partnership with Humana people to people Belize in the creation of four community hubs in Independence, Dangriga, Big Falls, and Punta Gorda. First Time the Department has a hub in Independence and Big Falls.
- For the first time Receiving 4 new vehicle to aid in Youth Development Work.

SPORTS

Upon taking office, the National sports council was just a statutory body designated specifically for the maintence of facilities with little to no support to sporting associations and federations. Since we took over in the COVID period, we took this time to strategies on ways we can be more impactful in sports and to the associations and federations. We immediately embarked on the following

- Rebranding of the National Sports Council Logo. It was important for the Sports Council start with a fresh look. We chose bright neutral colours.
- Held meeting with all stakeholders (this resulted on 90% of the associations to sign up once again with the national sports council) there had to be an incentive for these bodies to sign up. Some of the incentives are, financial support, access to facilities, tax exemptions on sports equipment imported in the country to name a few
- Meeting with Associatoins and federations
- Meeting with Football Federation of Belize
- Small financial support to all participating associations engaging in competition
- Support to community sports (individual athletes got financial support)
- The National sports council should be the regulating body of Sports in this country. For that to happen we had to ensure that we have Sports council representation countrywide. In this same aspect. New facilities which were under the control of area representatives under the last administration were handed over the NSC for management.
- Marion Jones houses our main National sports Council office and is our headquarters. This facility is less than 50% complete however when we took office we immediately embarked on making use of the space we have available. The first floor was converted into offices which now houses the following
 - · Sports cordinators office
 - NADO
 - FFB
 - Body building Federation
 - Justice of Peace main office
 - National Fire Department
 - · City Transport department

- Mexico Center- When we took over the Mexico center we immedialty embarked on a schedule for it to be properly used. The facility houses the following.
 - Basketball federation
 - Volleyball association
 - Table tennis
 - The national sports council found the need to properly equip all the local sports councils and facilities with the necessary resource and tools needed to get the job done. Never in history had the councils been given what they needed. We did the following
 - Transportation- each district got a new vehicle for coordinators to move around the districts when organizing sports and visiting schools. (Belmopan is yet to get a vehicle)
 - Uniforms- all Coordinators got a set of uniforms for well representation
 - · Sporting equipment- we are currently distributing a bank of equipment for each district to ensure they have the tools while coordinating sports. This is ongoing.
 - · Zero turn machines- given the number of facilities that need to me maintained. It was important to buy heavy duty equipment to keep our fields and facilities chooped and clean. Corozal has gotten their one and the rest is pending.
 - · Partnership with US sports schools
 - Training for sports coordinators
 - 11 MOU's signed
 - · With Ministry of Education- to ensure Physical education is taken more seriously. We are saying at least twice a week with properly trained PE
 - · With FFB- FFB has an office in most of our facilities. The exchange is in assistance with maintence of fields and buildings.
 - · With FFB and BTB- Berger Field project.
 - · With Body Building Federation. Gym at Marion Jones
 - With football Federation and Ministry of Education. Football for schools program.

1 The Establishment of a Project Unit



The objective is to lead in development and transformation of the trans port system in Belize, with its main priority to construct new transportation facilities, improve the bussing/ticketing system, implement, and execute new strategies.

2 The Launch of BMVRALS Project





BMVRALS is an Integrated and Centralized Transport System for the entire country by reforming and digitalizing the transport processes and services and introducing necessary audit mechanisms.

The System has provided major functions to process driver's licenses, vehicle licenses vehicleregistration, traffic tickets and revenue collection. Inadiation, the system provided capacity building for system management and maintenance and new service applications.


